Every cat in the twilight is grey.

In a night of full moon, we see the shadows as in the daylight, but the colours have disappeared.

When the heat of the sun overwhelms us, we look for the protective and refreshing shade. Between the dazzling brightness of the sun and the dense black of the night, the light brings out the shadows of the world.

The light and the shade are linked. When the light meets an obstacle, object, building, living being, it draws its shadow; its shape can then be seen. Object and light have colours which blend and complement each other.

Object and light are changeable and make the shade move.

- Competition is open to young people from 3 to 25 years old, following age groups: 3 to 5 years old, 6 to 9 years old, 10 to 13 years old, 14 to 17 years old, 18 to 25 years old and handicapped children.
- 2. Individual or collective participations are accepted.
- All forms of creation and all types of support are accepted.
 E.g.: drawing, pastel, painting, photography, sculpture, engraving...
- 4. Maximum sizes accepted:
 - drawings 1,20 m x 0,90 m
 - sculpture 0,70 m x 0,50 m x 0,40 m
- 5. Only one project per participant.
- Deadline for sending competing works on 21 february 2009.
- 7. Fill up the enclosed label in block letters and stick it at the back of work.
- 8. Works will be conveyed to Troyes under the competitor's responsibility.
- Jury's meeting on April 4th, 2009. 500 nominated works will be selected, of which 100 will be declared laureate.
- The jury is composed of professionals in visual arts and of personalities with an intercultural vision.

- 13. The 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize in each category will be awarded an arts box of respectively 100€, 85€ and 70€. The other laureates will share a global endowment of 5 000€ of professional arts material and will receive a Honour Diploma before July 15th, 2009.
- 14. All works remain property of the UNESCO Centre Louis François: therefore UNESCO Centre Louis François may use them to its own projects: they will be included in the collection of our Centre of Arts and Techniques for the Youth.
